STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

You have the right to cancel this enrollment agreement for and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later for educational service, any equipment or other goods and services. If the student has received Financial Aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of money not paid from federal student financial aid program funds. Business day means a day on which you were scheduled to attend a class. Cancellation occurs when you give written notice of cancellation at School address shown on the front page of this Catalog or as noted on the Enrollment Agreement. You can do this by mail, in person, by FAX or telegram. The notice of cancellation, if mailed, is effective when deposited in the mail, properly addressed with postage prepaid. This notice need not take any particular form; it needs only to state you wish to cancel the agreement. You will be given two notices of cancellation forms on the first day of class. If you cancel your enrollment, the School will refund any money that you paid within 30 days after your notice is received. [CA Ed Code §94911(e); §94919(b)]

A student officially dropping a course through the Registrar will receive prorated tuition and course fee refunds. If a student officially drops prior to the first class day of the course, AIS will refund full tuition. Students who officially drop after the first session but before completing 60% of the course will receive a prorated refund of the unused portion of tuition and other refundable charges. No refund will be made if a student drops after completing 60% of the course.

Program termination must be done correctly to prevent adverse financial and academic consequences. Students choosing to withdraw completely from AIS (quit the school) must notify the Admission's Office by completing a Complete Withdrawal form.
